

CFL APPLICANT TESTING REQUIREMENTS

Prior to an IAIL member sitting for the CFL test, the following requirements must be strictly adhered to:

The applicant must be a member in good standing in the IAIL for a period of one year prior to the testing date.

Applicant must have successfully passed mandatory IAIL sanctioned

- Investigative Locksmithing I, & II
- Auto theft and arson forensic
- Forensic report writing
- Forensic Case Management
- Expert Witness
- Photography

Must qualify and submit documents that will exhibit at least (75) Credit points, which are the minimum amount of points, which you must claim, to be able to qualify and sit for the test. (See application for details)

Applicant must author and submit for review an article for publication in the ALOA Keynotes magazine. The article must be relevant to the field of Forensics, and must be approved for publication by the IAIL CFL and Peer Review Committees. The article subject may include but is not limited to a relevant case study (redacted), research, procedural guidelines (or variations of existing guidelines)

The above requirements are subject to change. However, the once an application is submitted, the applicant will not be subject to the newer requirements.
